Last Monday, Mrs Light and Years 3 and 4 travelled to Armidale to visit the Aboriginal Cultural Centre and Keeping Place to view an art exhibition, an Aboriginal garden and edible foods and medicines, tools and dwellings. Years 5 and 6 are having a cake stall outside the Top Shop this Sunday morning to raise funds for their excursion to Canberra later in the year. This is a great opportunity to get some yummy treats while helping Years 5 and 6 on their way!

On Monday 9th March, commencing at 3:00pm there will be a parent meeting in the hall. The

new English and Mathematics syllabus will be explained and any questions in relation to these will be addressed. The meeting will be followed by afternoon tea. All staff look forward to meeting parents and caregivers.

English is the focus learning area for this newsletter. Mrs Blake and Years 2 and 3 present the class page.

Students in Kindergarten and Year 1 have had a busy term in English. Year 1 students are learning to write descriptions, information reports and narratives about pets. They are inspired by the books we are reading in our Literature unit. Kindergarten students are learning to compose and record simple sentences. Last week Kindergarten students commenced their guided reading lessons. We are proud of the progress they are making.

What a fantastic start to the year for Years 3 and 4 in English. They have been focussing on a set of books about bats and flying foxes. They have experimented with thick and thin questions giving short answers and extended answers. Predicting and visualising are skills that Years 3 and 4 now have a greater understanding of. Some pleasing spelling test results have been exhibited on Friday. All students are trying hard to do their best handwriting. In guided reading students use a bookmark with prompts and strategies showing skills for good readers. They have focussed on adjusting the speed of which they read, looking for keywords and identifying topic sentences.

Years 5 and 6 are absorbing themselves in the memory of ANZAC this term. The English unit focus is a story titled *'Lighthouse Girl'*, which is based on the real life story of Fay Howe. Fay communicates with soldiers heading off to Gallipoli and sends morse code messages home to their loved ones. Our 'teacher read', novel is *'Gallipoli—the diary of Victor March'*. Students are providing thoughtful pieces of writing and studying effective characterisation.

In English, students in Years 2 and 3 have been completing a range of activities based around the book 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory' by Roald Dahl. In this study, students will be listening to the story read throughout the term. Students have discussed how Charlie's life is different to their own. Students are also completing writina tasks based around descriptions of the characters. In guided reading the children have been reading a range of fairy tale stories and then discussing the hidden meaning through a range of verbal and written tasks.
