Many Stage 6 students will undertake their first or second work placement for their Vocational Education courses and Dubbo School of Distance Education teachers will visit to conduct practical assessments. HOW MUCH PHYSICAL ACTIVITY DO KIDS NEED?

Moderate intensity activities include fast walking or riding a bike or scooter.

Vigorous intensity activities make you 'huff and puff' and

include running, chasing and playing tag, and organised sports such as soccer or netball.

RECIPE: HONEY SOY CHICKEN STIR-FRY

INGREDIENTS	QUANTITY
Chicken breast, cut into strips	500g
Soy sauce	1/4 cup
Honey	2 Tbs
Garlic, minced	2tsp
Carrot cut into strips	2
Onion cut into wedges	1
Capsicum cut into thin strips	1/2
Udon noodles	2 x 200g



METHOD

- Combine chicken with soy sauce, honey and garlic. Set aside for 5 minutes to marinate.
- Heat oil in wok or frying pan over high heat. Drain chicken from marinade and stir fry in batches until just cooked through. Remove from wok and set aside.
- 3. Add vegetables to wok and cook lightly, stirring constantly.
- Return chicken and reserved marinade to wok with noodles and toss until heated through.

Tips: You can add as many vegetables as you like including: green beans, snow peas, mushrooms, zucchini, bok choy etc.
