Safe, responsible and respectful use of digital technology

Our children and young people have grown up with digital technology and it is woven into their lives. During COVID-19 many young people are using digital technology more often to learn and to socialise. Supporting children and young people to use technology in a safe, respectful and responsible manner allows for more active online learning that can increase student engagement and participation. It also supports access to a broader range of content and learning resources that can supplement students' learning experiences.

Being safe online is a shared responsibility for students, teachers, parents, carers and the broader community.

It is important that families can communicate with their children about how to use digital technology in safe, responsible and respectful ways.

Here are some key reminders for children and young people of how to stay safe online:

- Protect personal information, including name, address, school, email address, telephone number, pictures and other personal details
- Never share user names or passwords and only use your own
- Ask a teacher or other responsible adult for help if anyone online asks for personal information, wants to meet or offers money or gifts
- Let a teacher or other responsible adult know immediately if anything online that is suspicious, harmful or inappropriate
- Never hack, disable or bypass any hardware or software security, including any virus protection, spam and filter

It has been a remarkably busy fortnight throughout Stages 4 and 5 with Check-In Assessment and PAT Testing. Last week Years 7-9 completed their Check-In Assessment's for both Reading and Numeracy. These students are to be commended as they all worked extremely hard during the tests. Years 7 – 10 are currently finishing their online PAT Tests across Spelling, Punctuation, Vocabulary, Numeracy and Science.

Stage 4 are learning about population distribution in Australia and annual rainfall in Geography. Year 7 are continuing their work with CAD programs as they begin 3D printing some small objects. Year 8 have been designing hamburgers in Technology as part of their last unit for the year. Cattle club students have been battling the boggy conditions in order to get our two steers ready for the Northern Schools Steer Competition to be held in Inverell on the 17th of November. Unfortunately, we are unable to attend and parade the livestock due to the current restrictions. This year they will be judged in a pen at Macintyre High School prior to hook judging at Bindaree Beef.

Fiona McCormack will be working with our Secondary students on Tuesday the 16th and Friday the 26th of November. During these educational sessions Fiona will provide programs and information around issues such as sexting and vaping on the 16th and will run a Love Bites course on the 26th.

Staff have been planning alternate activities to be run in week 11 as a Term 5 program. These will consist of a variety of different activities and events in which students can elect to attend. Some of the programs may include basket weaving, tie dying, golf, tennis, film making, art, shearing and cooking.

TERM 4 ZOOM LESSONS

There were three energiser zoom lessons with at least 4 other schools participating. Session 1 was a fitness lesson, session 2 a wellbeing lesson and session 3 a Hip-Hop lesson. Students enthusiastically followed the presenter's instructions and dance moves to complete routines for each half hour.

Students have completed PAT Assessments this week in Spelling, Vocabulary, Grammar & Punctuation, Reading, Mathematics and Science. Teachers use assessment data to identify starting points for learning, target teaching and monitor growth comparing data from Term 1 to Term 4. These progressive achievement tests show that all learners can be supported to demonstrate progress, regardless of their starting point.



Kindergarten Orientation begins on Monday, 15th November 2021 from 9 – 10:30 am. We look forward to having the preschool students visiting our school over the coming weeks preparing themselves for 2022. All K – 6 students will welcome the preschool students and ensure their visits are thoroughly enjoyable.

The Bundarra Central School Public Speaking was conducted on Wednesday, 10th November 2021. The following students participated Brydee Harper, Katie McLean, Kadie O'Grady, Jayden Groth and Shania Kruger. The adjudicators Sandy Fitzgerald and Jenny Sloman from Glen Innes were very impressed with each of the students. 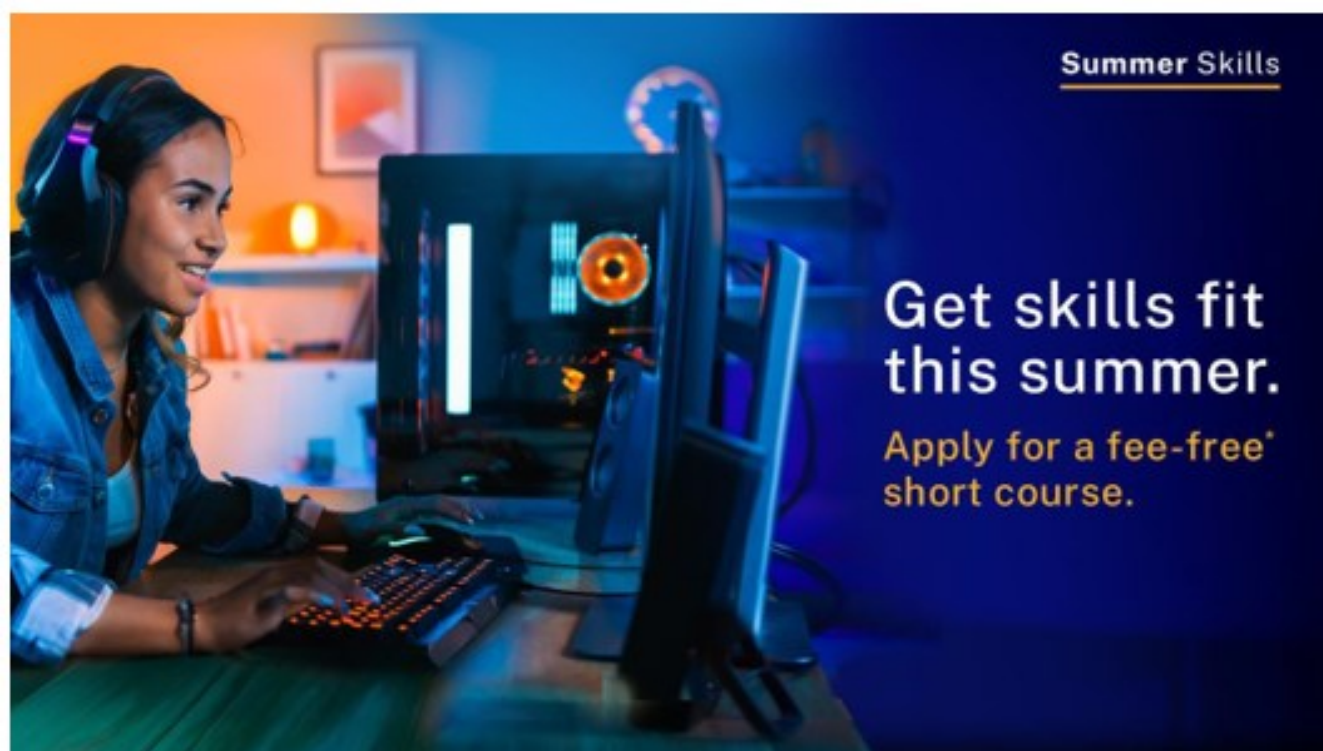

Student attendance at school

All students are expected to be at school unless they are unwell. Do not attend school if unwell, even with mild symptoms. Get tested for COVID-19 and follow NSW Health directions. Find your local [testing clinics](#)[External link](#).

- If you have any COVID-19 symptoms you will be sent home and must not return to school unless you have either:

- o isolated for 10 days, when no medical certificate is available

- o a negative COVID-19 test result and are symptom free.

- In circumstances where a student has other medical reasons for recurrent symptoms, a letter from your GP is sufficient to negate the requirement for a negative test.

Self-isolation periods and testing requirements differ for close contacts based on their exposure and vaccination status. If you are identified as a close contact, an authorised contact tracer from NSW Health

COVID-19 symptoms can include:



If your child is sick, keep them at home and get them tested for COVID-19.

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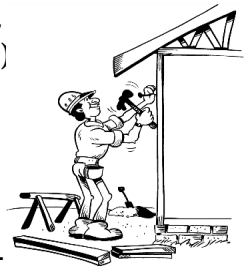
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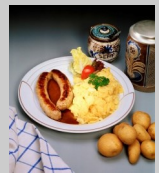

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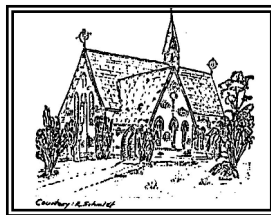
